1. Introductions
2. Donations from Amber's request last month provided tents and other items to the encampments, organized with other groups such as Salvation Army to ensure food in being delivered around once a day, informed occupants of COVID-19, to remain safer in place - need NEW socks, underwear, tents, tarps, thermometers, and sleeping bags
3. Pastor Lisa, update on "Harbor Area Relief Fund"
 - a. Coordinated with San Pedro Chamber of Commerce Quality of Life Committee and "Feed and Be Fed" (501(c)(3))
 - b. Financial donations accepted at the Feed and Be Fed website
 - c. Work in progress to help those most in need in our community, qualification factors being developed
 - d. Seed donation of \$20,000 has been given by County Supervisor Janice Hahn
 - e. James Allen suggested PBID be asked to donate. Amber to follow-up with Elise.
 - f. To cover SP, Wilmington, and Harbor City - using faith-based leaders in the community
 - g. Full accounting of funds is available, monthly reports will be sent by Amber.

4. Update from Gaby Medina from Councilmember Buscaino's Office
 - a. Two shelters in our district,
 - i. 109th Street, 28 beds, at capacity
 - ii. Normanville, 50 beds, 12-13 folks there now, opened this week
 - iii. Another considering being opened
 - b.
 - i. Wilmington 76% complete, San Pedro at 67% ~ drywall and restroom in, utilities installed now, open in early June
 - ii. Navigation Center won't be open until early June, construction delays based on parts
 - iii. Sunrise Hotels identified in SP, handed over to county to identify 100 vulnerable individuals, over 100 over 65 living in our district on the street for example
 - iv. Judge Carter requested more restrooms and handwashing systems, 285 delivered but not secured and some were stolen, one near Lomita encampment is being serviced twice a week
 - v. Senior Meals organized to help those who needed meals, found discretionary funds for it (\$500,000), 100 have signed up in district, at least 4 meals a week, SPHS graduate donated to help hungry families matching Buscaino's amount, is working with Boys and Girls Club and Buscaino's office, need referrals, working with local restaurants to supply food meeting dietary restrictions
 - vi. Medical supplies donated by Chinese-American community including 20,000 masks for first responders, 5,095 going to Harbor City Kaiser and Providence Little Company of Mary
