Dear Valerie,

The Central San Pedro Neighborhood Council (CSPNC) is in receipt of your letter dated February 15, 2020. Let it be known that the CSPNC views the Wilmington Neighborhood Council (WNC) as friends and colleagues, united in a common cause of bettering our respective neighborhoods as well as the greater Harbor community.

Los Angeles Harbor College is a valuable *shared community asset* serving students from Wilmington, San Pedro, Palos Verdes, Carson, Harbor City and its environs. It is governed not by the City of Los Angeles, but by the Los Angeles Community College Board serving nine campuses throughout the County.

We believe it is within our rights to voice the concerns outlined in our letter to President Otto Lee of LA Harbor College regarding safe parking. We do not see our letter in any way diminishing the right of WNC to voice their own respective views regarding said parking issue. Nor does our letter to President Lee in any way claim to represent the views of the WNC. Our Council is committed to finding solutions for homelessness and invites Wilmington to join us in solutions, particularly during this time of severe public health and economic crisis.

Terminal Island is also a valuable *shared community asset* serving greater Los Angeles, and San Pedro and Wilmington in particular. We are direct recipients of the benefits of the commerce conducted, as well as direct recipients of the environmental impacts from industries located there. In fact, the history of San Pedro is the history of Terminal Island.

We hope that going forward our two councils can come together and resolve our differences. While our respective councils represent two separate communities, we share a common history and have many shared interests as members of the Harbor community.
