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Dear Central San Pedro Council leaders,

Dear Neighborhood Council Colleagues:

This month Mayor Eric Garcetti will complete his tour of Neighborhood Council Alliances. We are thankful the Mayor has taken time out of his busy schedule to join us. He shared views about the progress the City is making in its response to the pandemic and recognized Neighborhood Councils for their on the ground support of their communities. He will continue his visits with the Neighborhood Council Alliances in September and plans to schedule follow-up visits again.

There are two Council Files to monitor in September. [Council File 20-0963](#) relative to the conduct of Neighborhood Council (NC) elections during the COVID-19 pandemic. The City Council approved this action (14-0) on August 26th. The Health, Education, Neighborhoods, Parks, Rivers, and Arts Committee (HeNPAR) approved [CF-20-0990](#) on August 27th. Introduced by Councilmember Bonin and seconded by Councilmember Paul Koretz, this motion directs the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners and Civil and Human Rights Commission to develop a plan for administering mandatory Diversity, Equity and Inclusion training and anti-bias training for all members of Los Angeles Neighborhood Councils.

Additionally, [Council File 18-0467](#) relative to amending the Los Angeles Administrative Code to establish a uniform minimum voting age, minimum board member service age, an optional youth board seat, and revising the definition of community interest stakeholder was passed by on August 25 by City Council (12-0).

We also suggest keeping a close eye on several policy and procedure updates. Items to be presented to the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners include a revision to the Code of Conduct Policy, introduction of a new 'Digital Media Policy', a presentation on the EmpowerLA and the Office of City Clerk's implementation of the Leadership Training Policy <https://empowerla.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/04/NC-Leadership-Orientation-Policy-2020-01-30.pdf>. The latter policy should be monitored closely as your input on how it is implemented will be important to us. Separately, the Department is developing policies and guidance on several topics. They include the use and availability of alcohol at NC meetings, guidance on the administration of candidate forums, and an internal procedure related to verification of stakeholder eligibility.

We also want to share that we have initiated a project to possibly modify the template language used in the Early Notification System. Feel free to send me an email if you would like to share your thoughts on how to improve the language. We will share more as that project advances.

Department Administration

In September, a second round of suspension notices is being sent to Neighborhood Council Board Members who are out of compliance with the Code of Conduct training and signature requirements. If you receive this notice, please prioritize completing the training and submitting your signature to the Department as soon as possible. Instructions for complying with the requirements, including the necessary links are included in the notice. For additional questions, please contact rosters@empowerla.org. The Department is working hard to

review our process and records review procedure to further improve the efficiency/accuracy of future notifications. We thank you for your patience as we work to make these improvements.

City Clerk Funding

Board Members, the deadline to renew your Funding Program training was extended for 3 months, from June 30th to September 30th. You can find your training expiration date on your Board roster page in DONE's website ([click here](#)) and also on your Monthly Profile newsletter issued by DONE.

NC Direct Support Operations

Since the transition over to virtual meetings, we've learned so much and are continuing to learn from our Neighborhood Councils. While we work to update the [EmpowerLA Virtual Governance \(EVG\) Protocols](#) over the coming weeks, here are a few "tech tips", we are highlighting to assist you in conducting virtual meetings.

- Video is allowed for host and panelist. The [EVG Settings](#) are set to allow video as an option for the "host" and "panelists". Video is optional and is not required.
- Be mindful of your "virtual environment." Your virtual environment includes your physical space which appears on video, your virtual background, background audio, and your attire. Your virtual environment should be void of any commercial advertising and political lobbying. Your virtual background should not be disruptive nor distracting to the meeting.
- Set up "[Recurring Webinars](#)" to keep the same Webinar ID number and panelists invited for each recurring webinar.

We encourage you to continue sharing "best practices" with the Department so that we can share more widely with the NC System.

Additionally, when dealing with disruptions during public comment for virtual meetings, please remember that under the Brown Act, NCs cannot prohibit public criticism of policies, procedures, programs, or services of the City or the acts or omissions of the neighborhood council itself. The First Amendment protects the public's free speech rights and the Courts have held that offensive, obnoxious and repugnant speech, including profanity and cursing is protected by the First Amendment.

While these comments can be disturbing, you will need to examine whether or not these comments are disruptive to your meeting. When addressing disruptions during public comment, remember to focus on

conduct and not speech in deciding when to act upon disruptive behavior. Should you experience disruptive behavior during public comment, please be sure to follow these three steps:

1. When the initial disruption occurs, offer a first warning to the speaker. The Chair should stop the time to offer a verbal warning to the speaker, and enter the disruption into the minutes. Then resume the speaker's time.
2. If the speaker refuses to stop the objectionable behavior, the Chair should repeat step 1, the request to stop, and emphasize that the speaker will be placed on mute if the behavior continues.
3. If after the third disruption (typically the third public comment by the individual) the person refuses to stop after the second warning, you can state: "You have been warned twice that you are disrupting this meeting and have been told to immediately stop your disruptive actions. Since you have chosen to disregard this request and continue being disruptive, I am requesting that you be muted for the remainder of the meeting", and mute the speaker.

Should persistent disruption continue, call a brief recess.

Due to the complexities of the Brown Act in relations to the First Amendment, we are advising NCs not to remove attendees from your meeting, but rather mute the speaker

Finally, the Department will be working over the next month to amend NC bylaws to reflect the recent ordinances passed by City Council.

NC Outreach and Elections

Last week, the Health, Education, Neighborhoods, Parks, Arts and Rivers (HENPAR) committee requested our Department along with the City Clerk to report back on ways we can get feedback for all Vote-By-Mail 2021 NC election. We will be scheduling 4 regional feedback sessions in Central/East, South LA, Harbor, West, and North/South Valley. The dates are TBD we will send you the information once the dates are approved.

We are working on a 2021 Marketing Plan to help guide us for the 2021 NC Elections. With limited funds, we will need to prioritize our resources.

NC Policy and Governmental Relations

Thank you to the Board of Neighborhood Commissioners for a wonderful meeting on Monday, August 17, 2020. Over 70 Neighborhood Council board members and stakeholders participated in this robust meeting.

This will be your opportunity to hear from and collaborate with other Homelessness Liaisons and also discuss how we can support you in your efforts to address homelessness in your communities. City Clerk Administration:

Due to public health and safety concerns as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, City Council has approved our plan to implement an all Vote-By-Mail election for Neighborhood Councils (NCs) in 2021. As we work to implement these elections, we will engage with NC leaders and stakeholders to obtain feedback and suggestions on how best to ensure equitable access to NC elections. Stakeholders are encouraged to complete the [Neighborhood Council Vote-By-Mail Election Survey](#) to share feedback and recommendations by Friday, September 4, 2020.

We will also partner with the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment to host four regional sessions to gather feedback from stakeholders across the City to help our office identify methods to provide more inclusive elections. Meeting details to follow.

Department staff is scheduled to present at the 2020 Congress of Neighborhoods on Saturday, September 26, 2020. The workshop will include information on the upcoming 2021 NC elections, including regional election timelines, how to register as a candidate, and the vote-by-mail process. Workshop information will be available in the coming weeks.

Board Members with Expired or Missing Mandatory Trainings

To vote on Neighborhood Council funding items, Neighborhood Council board members must have current ethics training and funding training. The Neighborhood Council bylaws may also require these trainings to vote for nonfunding items as well. To serve on a board, Neighborhood Council board members must also have either read and signed a Code of Conduct or have watched the video. To complete these trainings, please click [here](#).

NOTE: in person and online ethics training must be a minimum of 2 hours. If you complete the ethics training online, please ensure that you take 2 hours to complete the training as we will not accept any certificates that show less than 2 hours.

Board Members who have not completed the Funding training:

Funding – Eligibility to Vote on Financial Matters a. To be eligible to vote on any NC Expenditure, Financial Reports, and/or annual budgets, the board member must:

- Be an Elected, Appointed and/or Selected Board Member of the NC
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Have completed the California State Ethics Training Requirement for Local Officials (AB 1234)
- Have completed the online NC Board Member Funding Training and obtain a passing score of 70% on any test associated with the online course.

Board Members with missing or expired Ethics Certificates:

ETHICS – All Board Members are bound by California State Law to take Ethics Training every two years. Take the online course, and send your certificate to Rosters@EmpowerLA.org. Ethics Training is a required for all Board Members

Board Members who have not completed the Code of Conduct training or their certificate has expired:
