New California executive order requires that by 2035, all new cars and passenger trucks sold in California be zero-emission vehicles. The City of Los Angeles has already committed to going to an all-electric fleet of government vehicles, under the recently approved Electric Vehicle Master Plan. "

Locally the demand for electric vehicle charging stations continues to increase every day at public and workspace locations. And with newer housing and commercial developments being created in our area, there will be an even higher demand in the near future.

Currently there are about twenty public charging stations in the City of San Pedro, of those the majority are Level 2 charging stations, with only 3 being high speed charging stations.

The Central San Pedro Neighborhood Council request that more charging stations be provided in public areas throughout the city of San Pedro, including the Port of Los Angeles facilities.
