Vincent Thomas Bridge Community Advisory Committee meeting #1

Osama Megala -area manager with Caltrans provided brief project overview :

- 53000 vehicles daily including %9 heavy trucks.
- Replacing bridge deck is needed to extend bridge life several decades. Also replacing seismic sensors + upgrading bridge railings and median barrier.
- Construction begins Fall 2025. Opening to traffic Spring 2027.
- 3 stage options: Full closure for 12 months. Partial closure of 3 lanes for 24 months. Partial closure of 2 lanes for 36 months.

Currently the project is in the scoping phase to define the project, and identify potential impacts and issues of concern. Next phase will include Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Assessment.

Allison Colburn District 7 caltrans public information officer - overview of CAC process :

- Public comments will be accepted throughout the project timeline.
- Next solicitation for public comments will be when EIR is released, expectedly early 2024. 90 day comment period.
- 3 committees will work in concert: CAC - to serve as voice for the community, PAC - to advise caltrans on relevant policies, TAC - obtain multi-jurisdictional technical expertise and develop collaborative strategies to ensure safety and minimize project related impacts.
- CAC - comprised of community organizations, businesses, unions, community leaders. CAC's role is to serve as a voice for the communities, and as a collaborator to advise on strategies and mitigate potential project-related impacts.
- Best practice for organizations to designate one person (+ 1 alternate) to attend all meetings on behalf of the organization. Contact info should be available to post on the project website.
- Follow up meetings will be virtual. Wednesday evenings are the consensus. Monthly frequency.

Discussion of traffic impacts and potential mitigations will be held in future meetings. Traffic impact studies will be made available for each of the 3 stage options for the project. Caltrans will hire a consultant to officiate the meetings.
